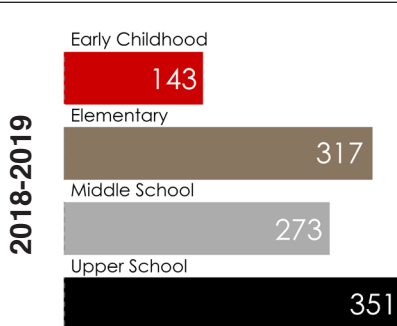
2018 - 2019 SCHOOL PROFILE

The School

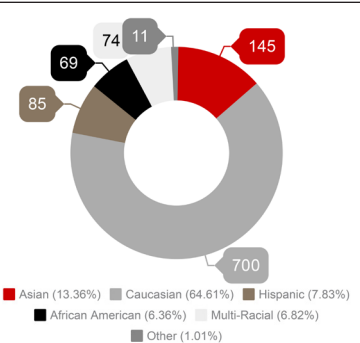
An International Baccalaureate World School, Carrollwood Day School was founded in 1981 and currently serves students from age two through 12th grade. In May 2009, the school graduated its first senior class. CDS is recognized nationally for its academic excellence and its innovative school-wide emphasis on character development. The curriculum for Carrollwood Day School follows the guidelines established by the International Baccalaureate Organization in Geneva, Switzerland in 1968. **CDS is one of only 18 schools in the United States authorized to offer the curriculum / continuum of IB programmes from early childhood to college preparatory.** Students enroll in the Primary Years Programme (PYP) from preschool through grade five, the Middle Years Programme from grades six through ten, and the Diploma Programme in grades eleven and twelve. The school emphasizes performance, collaboration, and moral character, believing in the importance of building an ethical learning community to define its students as the future leaders of a global society.

Lower School

ECC students can participate in after school Dance, Culinary Arts, Intramurals, and Soccer. Elementary students can choose from Art, Chess, Filmmakers Workshop, Girls Take Charge, Homework Help, Minecraft, Music Lessons, Nature Watch, and several sports/fitness clubs.

Middle School

Upper School

In addition to 20 general clubs, the Upper School also offers 14 "Breaking Ground" clubs that are 100% initiated and led by students. Clubs represent a wide range of interests including these General Clubs: AV League, CDS Ambassadors, Critter Club, Dance Committee, Engineering/Robotics, Future Business Leaders, History Club, Future Health Professionals, Human Rights Club, Investment/Stock Market Club, Key Club, Muslim Student Association, Newspaper, Singing Club, Spanish Club, Speech & Debate, Ted-Ed Club, Thespians, Yearbook. The 2018-2019 Breaking Ground Clubs include: 20/20, Analytical Athletics, Archery, Arts & Crafts, Calligraphy, Creative Writing, Diversity, Grilling Club, Jewish Forum, Math Club, Meditation, Ping Pong, and Red Reign/Spirit Club.

International Baccalaureate Programme

Carrollwood Day School is honored to partner with the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) to create a better world through education. Carrollwood Day School is the only school on the west coast of Florida to offer the full five-year MYP curriculum. CDS has been an IB World School since March 2005 and was the sixth school in the United States fully authorized to offer the continuum of PYP-MYP-DP curricula and the first IB World School in Florida to achieve this distinction.

Primary Years Programme (PYP): Prekindergarten - Grade 5

The PYP is a comprehensive approach to teaching and learning. The PYP focuses on the development of the whole child. Traditional academic subjects are part of the Programme, but it emphasizes the interrelatedness of knowledge and skills through a transdisciplinary program of inquiry.

Middle Years Programme (MYP): Grades 6 - 10

The MYP helps students develop learning attitudes and skills that will enable them to participate actively and responsibly in society. Learning how to evaluate information critically is as important as learning facts. The students' experience with the MYP culminates in their sophomore year with a yearlong Personal Project where students choose and explore a topic of their choice that showcases their unique interests and talents.

Diploma Programme (DP): Grades 11 - 12

The IB Diploma Programme is a rigorous pre-university course of studies that meets the needs of highly motivated secondary school students. Unlike most IB schools, at CDS the IB Diploma Programme is designed to be inclusive so a student can register as a full IB Diploma Candidate or as an IB Course Candidate, based on his or her individual needs for academic rigor.

Requirements of the IB Curriculum

9th and 10th Grades (Middle Years Programme):

- Minimum of 8 courses (5 core) per semester
- At least 25 hours of community service per year
- Completion of the Personal Project consisting of a process journal, a final product and a personal statement
- The study of at least 2 languages (language of instruction and additional language of choice) as well as design technology and fine arts courses each year

11th and 12th Grades (Diploma Programme):

- Minimum of 6 core courses per semester
- **Extended Essay (EE):** 4,000-word research essay on a topic of special interest
- **Theory of Knowledge (TOK):** 1-credit Philosophy course with a required presentation and 1,600-word essay
- **Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS):** 18 months of continuous hours in artistic pursuits, athletics, and/or community service work for appreciation of life outside the classroom
